Jiro Hanyu

Chairman, Institution for Transport Policy Studies (ITPS)



Before becoming Chairman of the Institution for Transport Policy Studies (ITPS) in July of 2007, Mr. Hanyu was President of Japan International Transport Institute (JITI), an internal office of ITPS. Mr. Hanyu had served as an official of the Japanese government for more than 33 years. He has held various important positions including Vice-Minister for Transport and International Affairs.

When the Ministerial Conference -A New Challenge for Environmentally Friendly Transport- was held in Tokyo in January 2002, he played a leading role in adopting the Ministerial Declaration on Transport and the Environment and the Transport Ministers' Statements on "Prevention of Marine Pollution", "Urban Transport and Environment" and "the Comprehensive Strategy for Environmentally Friendly Vehicles." Under Mr. Hanyu's leadership, the development of environmentally-friendly heavy-duty vehicles, including the DME truck, started.

From 1994 to 1998, Mr. Hanyu served as the Deputy Director-General, and later as the Senior Deputy Director-General of the Civil Aviation Bureau. Mr. Hanyu took the lead in concluding the 1998 Memorandum of Understanding, an historic aviation agreement between Japan and the United States.

Mr. Hanyu graduated from Tokyo University in 1969 with a bachelor's degree in economics.
